
Dear Mrs. Hudson:

The Screening Framework and Guidelines in Docket No. 7873 and No. 7874, as modified by the Public Service Board (Board) on February 20, 2014, at paragraph 3.f., require that Reliability Plans be filed annually no later than April 1. Yesterday, Green Mountain Power (GMP) requested an extension until Friday, April 4 to file the Plans in order to assure the Plans did not contain Critical Energy Infrastructure Information ("CEII"). GMP is now satisfied that the Plans do not contain CEII and hereby submits updates to Reliability Plans for GMP's St. Albans area and Rutland area. GMP apologizes to the Board and parties for any inconvenience caused by this delay.

The Rutland Area Reliability Plan, which addresses a subtransmission reliability deficiency, will require additional analysis but provides guidance to SPEED standard-offer plant developers on MW, location and operating characteristics that may be required for a NTA solution. The Rutland Area Reliability Plan could not be finalized due to uncertainties and dynamic changes in the Rutland area. An updated Project Specific Action Plan is provided. The St. Albans Area Reliability Plan, which addresses a distribution constraint, concludes that GMP will not be proposing additional measures at this time, including SPEED standard-offer plants.
